who have not yet experienced that sense of pride I just spoke of. They don't know what they don't know. In the September 23rd edition of the Wall Street Journal, an opinion piece appeared under the title 'Old Veterans Organizations Are Fading Away'. The piece struck a chord with me so if I may, I'd like to share some of the facts.

- Veterans' groups across the country are facing declining membership
- Honor guards for veteran funerals are becoming difficult to staff
- The average age of Veterans' group has risen in recent years some like the American Legion, VFW & the Marine Corps League have an average age of 80 years
- Younger veterans who served during the past 20 years, are not joining Veterans' groups as did their fathers and grandfathers
- In 2019, there were 6,261 suicides among veterans, that's about 17 per day!

One would then logically ask, how many of the veterans who took their own life would have done so if they had meaningful relationships with a concerned peer. There are no studies that would answer this for us however we know and appreciate the value and significance of good peer relationships. Few civilians who have never seen military service can be an effective peer – only another veteran who have been there and done that can serve that important role. Where are those veterans? - They are in veteran's groups like our own.

Have you ever thought that by inviting another veteran to join the Marine Corps League you may be saving their life? The facts would suggest this could be true for many, especially younger veterans.



The Tun Tavern (the "Tavern")

Historically, it is regarded as the "First Brew House" built by Samuel Carpenter in 1685 on Philadelphia's historic waterfront at the corner of Water St. and Tun Alley leading to what is now known as "Penn's landing".

Carpenter's purpose in building the Tavern was to commence the development of the Philadelphia's historic waterfront which he intended as a site for various businesses. The Tavern soon developed a reputation for fine beers in the City of Philadelphia and maintained that reputation for over a century. Its name is derived from the old English word "Tun" meaning measured cask, barrel, or keg of beer.

1732 ~ The Masonic Temple in Philadelphia, recognizes the Tavern as the birthplace of the Masonic teachings in this country; there are estimated to be over 2.3 million Masons in the United States today.

1756 ~ Colonel Benjamin Franklin organized the Pennsylvania Militia and utilized the Tavern as a gathering place to recruit the area's first regiment of soldiers to suppress Indian uprisings.

1775 November 10, 1775, Robert Mullan, the proprietor of the Tavern and son of Peggy Mullan, was commissioned by an act of Congress to raise the first two battalions of Marines, under the leadership of Capt. Samuel Nicholas, the first appointed Commandant of the Continental Marines. Nicholas's grandfather was also a member of the Tun Tavern Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons and it is this relationship between Mullan, Nicholas and the Tavern which has resulted in Tun Tavern being acknowledged as the birthplace of the United States Marine Corps. There are an estimated three million active and retired U.S. Marines worldwide who have been exposed in their military training to the historical significance of Tun Tavern.



"NOVEMBER MARINE CORPS HISTORY Continental Marines 10 November 1775 to April 1783





Some evidence suggests the flag the Marines carried ashore at New Providence in 1776 was the Grand Union Flag. It consisted of 13 stripes and the Grand Union flag in the top inner corner. Another possibility is the infamous Gadsden flag or the rattlesnake flag with the image of a snake and the words "Don't Tread on Me."

1st 1943: 3d Marine Division lands at dawn Empress Augusta Bay, Bougainville

5th 1903: Major John Lejeune lands battalion to ensure Panamanian independence.

10th 1918: 5th Marines make night crossing of the Meuse River against German resistance.

10th 1948: First eight enlisted women are sworn in as Regular Marines.

10th 1954: Marine Corps War Memorial dedicated next to Arlington National Cemetery.

12th 1908: President Theodore Roosevelt removes Marines from U.S. warships.

15th 1950: Elements of the 1st Marine Division reached the Chosin Reservoir in North Korea.

20th 1943: 2nd Marine Division assaults Betio Island of Tarawa Atoll in Central Pacific.

20th 1947: Marine reservists started Toys-for-Tots in Los Angeles.

21st 1945: VMB-613 is decommissioned at Miramar, CA.

27th 1950: Marines engage Chinese Communists in North Korea near the Chosin Reservoir.

28th 1775: Samuel Nicholas commissioned as Captain, becomes the first Marine officer.
